I. Overview

- This report is a summary of notes from a UC situational awareness call that took place on 3/23/20 at 0900, campus emergency management Situation Reports, and information from other systemwide coordination. All information is accurate as of the date/time of the report.
- For brevity, some updates/actions listed in previous reports have been deleted.

II. Federal/State Guidance and Actions

Travel Related

• The U.S. State Department has issued a <u>global Level 4 Health Advisory – Do Not Travel</u> for all international travel.

Higher Education Specific

Clinical/Equipment Guidance

- CDPH has issued a COVID-19 Mitigation Playbook.
- CDPH has issued <u>Guidance for Prioritization of Patients for Laboratory Testing for COVID-19</u>.
- CDC has launched a new online <u>interactive COVID-19 symptom self-checker</u>. The self-checker helps users make decisions about seeking appropriate medical care. This system is not intended for diagnosis or treatment of COVID-19 or other diseases.
- CDC posted additional guidance on COVID-19 for clinicians and health care facilities, including Disinfecting Your Facility if Someone is Sick and a Clinician Toolkit.
- CDC issued <u>Interim Guidance for Discontinuation of Home Isolation for Persons with</u> COVID-19.
- CDPH issued <u>new guidelines</u> for transferring deceased persons suspected of or confirmed to have COVID-19.

Other Actions

- CDC is offering advice for state and local community leaders to <u>Take Advantage of the</u> 15 Day Pause to Slow the Spread of COVID-19.
- The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) warns individuals to continue to remain vigilant for scams related to COVID-19. Cyber security incidents have increased dramatically.
- Governor Newsom in conjunction with the CA State Public Health Officer and Director of the CDPH <u>issued a Stay At Home order</u>.



- The White House issued guidance urging people to stay home and avoid groups larger than 10 for the next 15 days, avoid eating at restaurants, not visit nursing homes or long-term care facilities, and more.
- COVID-19 diagnostic testing is now available at 22 <u>California public health labs</u>.
 Commercial labs are also offering diagnostic testing.

III. UCOP Updates

- On 3/20 UCOP updated <u>COVID-19-Related Leave for Academic Appointees: Guidance for Supervisors</u> to address frequently asked questions.
- UCOP and campus leaders are coordinating with State of CA representatives concerning the potential use of UC dormitories for the statewide COVID-19 response.
- President Napolitano issued an executive order granting up to 16 days of paid administrative leave for employees unable to work for COVID-19 related reasons (3/16).
- UCOP has activated a UC Health Coordination Committee (UC-HCC) of the UCOP MRT to better coordinate across the five health locations.
- UCOP has transitioned to telework in alignment with business functions and operational needs. UCPath (Riverside) operating remotely.
- All locations should plan for the continuity of governance and implement adequate social distancing and remote meetings as appropriate.
- UCOP has issued guidance regarding paid leave and remote work provisions.
- Guidance for UC Locations for COVID-19 was last updated 3/8/20.
- UCOP Management Response Team (MRT) changed its meeting cadence to Mon/Thurs. The Response Support Team (RST) is meeting as needed. The RST is establishing a Procurement Unit.
- The next joint MRT-Vice Chancellors of Administration (VCA) meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 3/25/20.
- All executive policy decisions that require input from UCOP should follow the established local crisis management processes for campuses and medical centers respectively.

Irvine	 Donations management a new focus. Received 40 surplus ventilators from County through the resource request process. Continuing to implement supply restrictions related to specific PPE items.
Los Angeles	 Conducting in-house testing for COVID-19. Began outpatient "drive-through" testing on 3/9. Implementing supply restriction measures. Continue to plan for patient surge. Preparing for both indoor and outdoor strategies.
San Diego	 Low supply of swabs is a critical issue. Conducting in-house testing for COVID-19. Can perform up to 1,000/day by 3/25 if they can get swabs. Implementing supply restriction measures. All products remain available for patient and staff safety.
San Francisco	 Low supply of swabs is a critical issue Working to expand ICU space/add ICU beds at Mt Zion. Continue to focus on PPE management and surge readiness.

ANR	 Assessing what research can continue. Transitioned all 70 locations statewide to telework through at least 4/7/20.
Berkeley	 Turnaround time on testing from Quest is at least a week. Campus is in "physical maintenance" only mode.
Davis	Testing very limited.Respiratory clinic open.
Irvine	 Quarantining 4 non-PUI campus community members based on travel history Developing drive through testing clinic. However, low on swabs. Implementing operational changes at Student Health to promote social distancing and patient management.
Los Angeles	 Working on plan to deploy some healthcare workers to support UCLA Health operations. Dining Halls have transitioned to "to-go" operations only. Activated virtual campus Emergency Operations Center.
Merced	1 PUI tested negative
Riverside	 Analyzing impacts to campus construction projects. Campus was "closed" by Riverside County Public Health order



	 (res halls not subject to closure order). Only essential personnel supporting critical campus functions allowed to work on campus. Implementing operational changes at Student Health to promote social distancing and patient management.
San Diego	4 PUIs in quarantine in on-campus housing.
San Francisco	 Donations Management coordinated across UCSF/UCSF Health, seven day/week, 0800-1700 Large donations are coordinated with Supply Chain at Oyster Point (80K warehouse). Employee drive-through testing occurring at Laurel Heights by appointment. Mobilizing to implement telehealth options as appropriate and in alignment with public health guidance. Continue to monitor individuals returning from Level 3 and 2 countries.
Santa Barbara	 22 tests pending with Quest; turnaround time is at least 8 days. To lower campus density, urging students who can safely leave to do so and to take all personal items from university-owned housing. Implementing operational changes at Student Health to promote social distancing and patient management.
Santa Cruz	 Tracking 40-50 returned travellers. All asymptomatic. Isolation and quarantine space an ongoing issue.
LBNL	 Operating in "safe and stable stand by" mode. Curtailing on-site operations to essential staff only. EOC virtual activation
