
WHAT HAVE UNIONS DONE FOR ME?

WORKING PEOPLE STOOD TOGETH-

ER in unions to win fair wages and create the great American middle class. Together, we won the 40-hour work week, paid vacations, paid sick leave, healthcare, and a dignified retirement. Today, unions are the only counterbalance workers have against overpaid and out of touch executives.

BY STANDING TOGETHER AS TEAMSTERS, MEMBERS:

- Won raises for clerical & administrative workers totaling 66.2% over 12 years;
- Won raises for Skilled Trades workers of up to 38.2% over seven years. Newer Trades Teamsters received double the raises of non-represented workers;
- Protected our benefits by maintaining our guaranteed pension, and winning limits on increases in employee costs for retirement, medical, and parking;
- Won greater protection for workers facing unjust discipline;
- Passed the first workplace anti-bullying law in California history.
- Passed legislation that enables the Public Employment Relations Board to levy fines when public institutions engage in Union busting activity.

Stewards work with their Union Representatives and members in their workplace to ensure that management follows our contract and respects our rights. Stewards mobilize members into action, empowering workers to create change while educating us on our rights.
